Re: Force Majeure Notice – Plant Closure Due to Coronavirus

Dear Customer,

This letter is to inform you that Tenneco is experiencing frustration or a force majeure event as a result of the well-documented Coronavirus (also referred to as COVID-19 or SARS-CoV-2) pandemic that is impacting people, communities, operations, travel, transportation, and much more worldwide.

Please be advised that our location in El Paso, Texas will close its operations due to the ongoing Coronavirus situation as of April 12, 2020. We anticipate that this closure will continue until at least April 27, 2020 but may be extended depending on how the Coronavirus situation develops. We are taking all available measures to address this serious matter as quickly as possible and to re-open our facility as soon as possible, but unfortunately these unforeseen events will prevent our ability to deliver products to you.

We regret that this situation may have an impact on you as our customer. Rick Lopez, Thomas Tran or myself, will be in contact with you shortly to advise as to what shipments we are able to make at this time, if any, and will be in contact with you prior to our operations re-starting to discuss ramp up and order requirements. Please note that once this crisis has passed, it may take Tenneco some time to bring its operations back up to normal – but you have Tenneco's commitment to support such efforts to the best extent it is able.

We take the health and safety of our employees, their families, and our customer and suppliers seriously, and we will be monitoring this Coronavirus situation closely. We will provide further updates when available.
